LABOR FORCE SUMMARY


This labor force assessment identified and analyzed the labor shed (that is, the geographic area from which a company could reasonably hire workers from) for 1 Malcolm Ave, Teterboro, NJ. The four key criteria analyzed included Labor Supply, Labor Demand, Labor Costs, and Organized Labor.

Based on the results, Site Selection Group believes the distribution labor force accessible to Teterboro to be favorable overall, and no major deficiencies were uncovered.

COMMUTE & LABORSHED ANALYSIS

The map below shows warehouse and distribution occupation concentration by home ZIP code. Darker blue ZIP codes represent a higher percentage of the resident labor force working in the distribution occupation cluster.



The accurate labor shed around Teterboro is **35 minutes**. There are **2,156** warehouse laborers that leave this tighter **20-minute radius** for jobs outside the area, indicating the potential to hire these workers who are commuting elsewhere for jobs.



- Warehouse worker and supplement labor concentration are slightly below the national average.



Key Demand, Costs, and Union Takeaways

- Job posting data indicate lower demand for warehouse workers than the broader metro. Demand is also lower than the national average for warehouse workers given the large labor force.
- Industry growth rate in this labor shed is lower than the metro.
- There is union activity in this area as seen by the moderate unionization rate and recent count of filings.
- Median wages for warehouse workers are higher than other submarkets. Wage escalation and cost of living tend to be higher in the labor shed than the metro.

LABOR SUPPLY

Potential to leverage ~2,156 warehouse workers who commute out of the area.

There are over 3,000,000 workers in this labor shed with more favorable target age and target income demographics than the broader metro area.

 The industry growth rate and posting intensity data is comparatively favorable due to significant labor.

Teterboro, NJ

This densely populated region has a large and demographically well aligned workforce with the potential to leverage warehouse workers who are currently commuting outside the labor shed.

While wages and cost of living are generally elevated in this region, labor demand is moderate comparatively.

No major deficiencies were uncovered.
